

# The Circle Quilt



The Circle Quilt is a great way to play with color. You can use a fabric collection or select fabric on your own. You will receive detailed written instructions in class and Mary will walk you through how to construct these blocks. You do not need to be afraid of curves!

The class project will be to create four circles that you can make into a table topper, wall hanging or table runner. If you prefer, you can go on to make a regular size quilt.

Instructor  
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Your instructor will demonstrate techniques and coach you through sewing curves. After trimming squares, you will arrange and sew squares together. Fabric selection and layout options will be further discussed in class.

## **Class Supplies**

### **\_\_\_ Fabric:**

Notes on fabric selection: Fabrics should be coordinated, but not too much. Having variety in scale (large prints to small prints), value (lights to darks), and adding some geometric patterns (stripes, dots, etc.) will make your quilt more interesting. You can dive into your stash or buy about 8 fat quarters.

### **Cut before class**

Sixteen 8 ½ inch squares

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Fabric for backing, binding. You will not need this for class, but if you want to buy it at the same time you will need about 1 yard for both.

- \_\_\_ Thread that coordinates, though thread color is not important
- \_\_\_ Scissors for cutting fabric
- \_\_\_ Scissors for cutting paper
- \_\_\_ Sewing machine (only a straight stitch is required for this technique)
- \_\_\_ Usual sewing supplies: pins, bobbins, seam ripper, and so forth
- \_\_\_ Pencil or pen for notes
- \_\_\_ Cutting mat, ruler, cutter; these will be used to square up blocks.
